# Join us in San Diego!

## As we hold the 2013 CSAM State of the Art Conference, a transformational change in substance abuse treatment will begin to unfold.

27 million uninsured Americans will begin signing up for the health insurance exchanges mandated under the Affordable Care Act (ACA). While currently only nine percent of the 21.6 million who need it receive specialty substance abuse treatment (NSDUH 2011), by requiring that substance abuse treatment and prevention be considered "essential services," many of those ninety-one percent will now gain access. To treat this huge influx of patients, addiction medicine and primary care providers need to partner effectively.

### Thursday morning:

Our conference will help prepare for this sea change. **Richard Saitz, MD, MPH**, and **Daniel Alford, MD, MPH**, will review the evidence base and share practical clinical experience helping us meet the challenges of primary care and addiction medicine integration and collaborative practice. We are fortunate to hear from **H. Westley Clark, MD, JD, MPH**, Director, Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (CSAT) on how the ACA will impact addiction medicine practice.

### Thursday afternoon:

The latest research in the addiction field will provide useful lessons for clinicians. **George Koob, PhD**, will give an update on the latest research in addiction vaccines as well as the neuroplasticity of addiction. **Staci Gruber, PhD**, will present her research on how cannabis impacts adolescent neurocognition. Covering the other end of the life cycle will be an update on the assessment and treatment of addiction in our population of aging baby boomers by **David Oslin, MD**. We are also pleased to have **Robert Lustig, MD**, present a medical update linking obesity and the metabolic syndrome epidemic, to sugar's impact on the brain reward system.

### Saturday morning:

Cutting-edge best practices in addiction medicine will be presented. In addition to updates on stimulant and tobacco treatments, **Hugh Myrick, MD**, will discuss the use of anti-convulsant agents for alcohol withdrawal. **Walter Ling, MD**, will discuss the implications of the new DSM-V on addiction medicine. Finally, we will end our plenary with a debate on long-acting opioid antagonist therapy (naltrexone) versus opioid agonist therapy for opioid analgesic use disorders.

**ADDITIONAL HIGHLIGHTS:** We are privileged to have **George Vaillant, MD**, as our discussant for a showing of clips from the 2012 documentary, **Bill W.** on Thursday evening.

This year's State of the Art Conference will offer more opportunities for interacting with other participants: facilitated discussions at your tables; lunch at interest tables with colleagues; a poster session highlighting education projects and practice; a 12-step demonstration meeting; and, Friday evening, a marina BBQ dinner accompanied by the Steve Feierabend Jazz Trio.

### Friday morning:

Nowhere is the integration of primary care and addiction medicine more challenging than in addressing prescription opioid abuse. Offering evidence-based and practical guidance on managing prescription opioid abuse and pain will be **Daniel Alford, MD, MPH**, and **Karen Miotto, MD**. Related legal issues will be reviewed.

### Friday afternoon:

Engaging people in substance abuse treatment and relapse prevention depends on effective counseling and self-care approaches. In addition to presenting the latest research on motivational interviewing and mindfulness-based relapse prevention, this session introduces attendees to counseling tools, including helpful recovery smartphone apps. **Lee Ann Kaskutas, DrPH**, will present research on what factors best mediate 12-step work, and **Timmen Cermak, MD**, will talk about why addiction treatment clinicians should self-prescribe Al-Anon. The afternoon will end with an interactive group experience to help us, as clinicians, reclaim the meaning of addiction medicine.

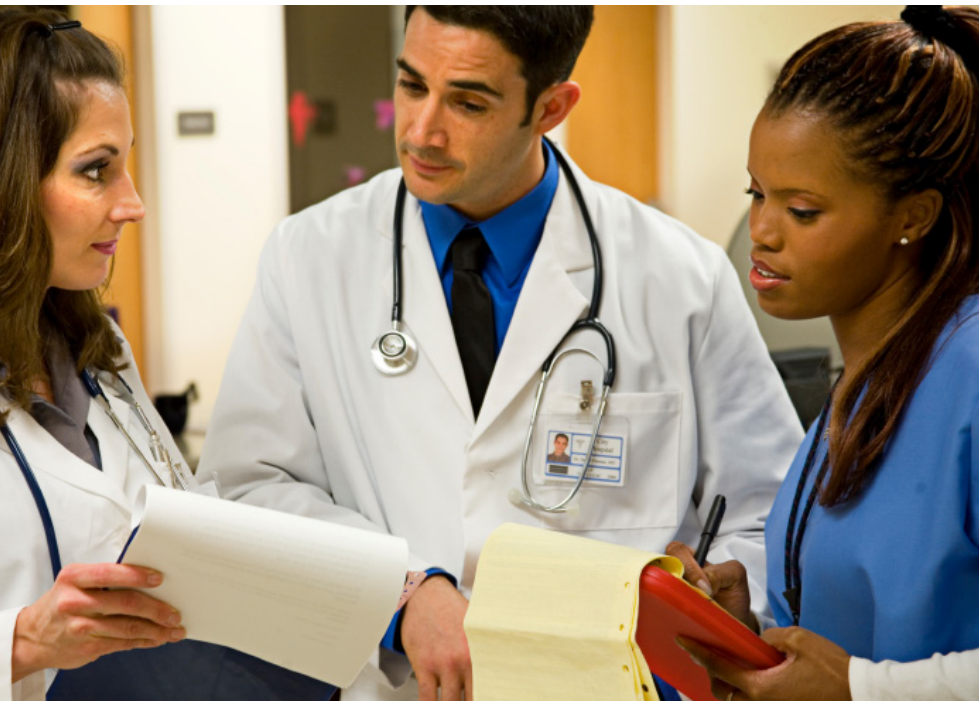
